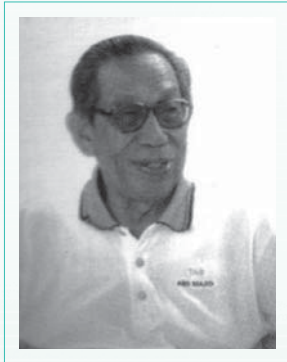

A Tribute in Memory of Tan Sri Dato' Seri Dr Haji Abdul Majid bin Ismail



Abdul Majid ("Coco") as he was fondly called) was truly a son of the soil.

He was born in 1921 in his grandfather's house in Kampong Baru, Kuala Lumpur, to a machinist with the Central Railway Workshops in Sentul. He was the eldest of twelve children, and had his early education in the Segambut Malay School, and then in the Maxwell Boys' English School, the Batu Road School and the Victoria Institution where he took the Senior Cambridge Examination in 1939, emerging as the top Malay student.

Abdul Majid entered the King Edward VII College of Medicine in Singapore in 1940, but his study was soon after interrupted by the Japanese Occupation, re-joining in 1947 at the end of the War, and graduating in 1950 with the degree of MBBS.

He did his houseman training in General Hospital Kuala Lumpur in 1951 and, on a Queen's scholarship, he obtained the Fellowship of the Royal College of Surgeons Edinburgh in 1955. On returning from Edinburgh, he was sent back to the United Kingdom for the Masters course in Orthopaedics in Liverpool the following year and he obtained his MChOrth Liverpool in 1957, after training at the Robert Jones and Agnes Hunt Orthopaedic Hospital in Oswestry.

He served as an orthopaedic surgeon in General Hospital Kuala Lumpur from 1958, and as the country's first Malaysian Chief of Orthopaedic Surgery from 1959 till 1968.

In 1969, he was appointed the Director of Planning & Research, Ministry of Health, becoming the Director General of Health in 1971.

Abdul Majid was appointed initially to the Divisional Council University of Malaya in Kuala Lumpur in 1959, and then from 1960 in the Council of University of Malaya, serving as Chairman of the Council from 1978 to 1987, a total of 28 years.

He was the founder President of the Association of Fellows of the College of Surgeons Edinburgh which later in 1960 became the College of Surgeons of Malaysia and he remained its President till 1973. The AM Ismail Oration of the College was eponymously named after him in 1973, with the first orator having been Professor G B Ong.

He was the founder President of the Malaysian Orthopaedic Association in 1967, serving till 1982 in that position. He was also the President of the Malaysian Rehabilitation Council for many years.

In 1981, the ASEAN Orthopaedic Association (comprising the national orthopaedic associations of Indonesia, Malaysia, Philippines, Singapore and Thailand) was inaugurated and Abdul Majid was its Founding Vice-President.

Besides his professional contributions, Abdul Majid had also served as President of the Royal Lake Club, Kuala Lumpur and as President of Senior Asian Government Officers Association SAGOA. He was also Chairman of the INTI College, a private tertiary educational institution.

Tan Sri Abdul Majid was an avid golfer and had played alongside numerous Sultans and foreign dignitaries during his life time, and had also established the Selesa Hill Homes & Golf Course not far from Kuala Lumpur.

He had received numerous Federal and State honours in recognition of his professional and social services.

His achievements from humble beginnings to an epitome of excellence and perfection will serve as an inspiration for all young Malaysians in the years to come.

With the passing away of Tan Sri Abdul Majid's on 24th March 2013 after a long illness, the country has lost one of the foremost icons in the orthopaedic and surgical fields, a pioneer in spirit and a patriot at heart, one who absorbed and grew with the strength and fraternity of his countless friends and colleagues from all sectors and strata of the multi-national milieu of our country. We will remember him for these priceless qualities and much more.

The College records its deepest sentiments and emotions and conveys them to Puan Sri Khairany, their son, Dr Aljafri, and daughters Elisha and Ellina, and all their grand-children and family on the loss of Tan Sri Abdul Majid bin Ismail.

“Surgery for Colorectal Liver Metastasis”

Citation by Associate Professor Dr Razman Jarmin



Christopher Christophi is Professor of Surgery and Director of Surgery clinical services at the University of Melbourne Department of Surgery, Austin Hospital, Australia. He graduated from the University of Monash (1972) and received his Medical Doctorate in liver transplantation from the same university in year 2000. He has been awarded fellowship of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons (1980), the Royal College of Surgeons (England, 1981) and the American college of Surgeons (1986). His link with Malaysian surgeons started as early as 1979 when he received a fellowship appointment and served as a lecturer and surgeon in the Department of Surgery, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia. His clinical interests extend from laparoscopic cholecystectomy to liver transplantation but he has a particular interest in the management of colorectal liver metastasis and pancreatic diseases. Under his leadership the Department of Surgery at Austin Hospital has become one of the leading centres in hepatobiliary and pancreatic diseases.

Professor Christophi has led significant clinical, academic and service developments in the Department of Surgery at Austin Hospital in Melbourne. His academic surgical unit has an outstanding record of producing clinician scientists. He has published extensively with more than 100 articles in peer-reviewed journals. He is also an editorial board member in several leading surgical journals. He was the recipient of KW Warren Traveling Fellow in Hepatobiliary Surgery to New England Baptist Hospital in Boston. He was appointed as the Chairman of the National Board in General Surgery and Post Fellowship Training Board and Chairman for Upper Gastrointestinal and Hepatobiliary Section of the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. He is a Council member of the Asia Pacific Hepato-Pancreatic-Biliary Association. He was made the convenor for the AHPBA Congress in Melbourne in 2011.

He has also contributed significantly in the training of undergraduate and postgraduate in the field of surgery. He has pioneered the Master of Surgical education in collaboration between the University of Melbourne and the Royal Australasian College of Surgeons. This programme supports the surgical education training using a novel distance e-learning system. He also started an international fellowship programme in hepatobiliary and transplantation since 2005. Beside the clinical commitments, he has developed a very strong research cultures in the field of surgery which are able to facilitate research activities for both the undergraduate and post doctorate programme. He had received honorary appointments internationally including visiting professor to University of Witwatersrand, South Africa, University of Chong Qing, China, University of Urumqui, China and University of Beijing, China.

Having been appointed as an Adjunct Professor at Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia since 2007, his experience working in Malaysia in 1979 has given him a golden opportunity in sustaining the bridge between Australia and Malaysia in the field of surgery. His stay in Malaysia during those periods had made him understood the culture and diversity that Malaysia has. He had used the experience to advise the Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia surgical department on how to develop a sustainable surgical academic institution that excel in academic, research and clinical services. He had been regularly invited as an external examiner to the Masters of General Surgery examination and had actively involved in the review of the curriculum exercise for post graduate training. Through the collaboration, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia was able to send lecturers for further training in Australia and developed student exchange programme with the University of Melbourne.

In view of his significant contribution in the field of surgery and post-graduate training in surgery particularly in Masters of General Surgery, I have the honour to present Professor Christopher Christophi as the 2013 A M Ismail Orator.

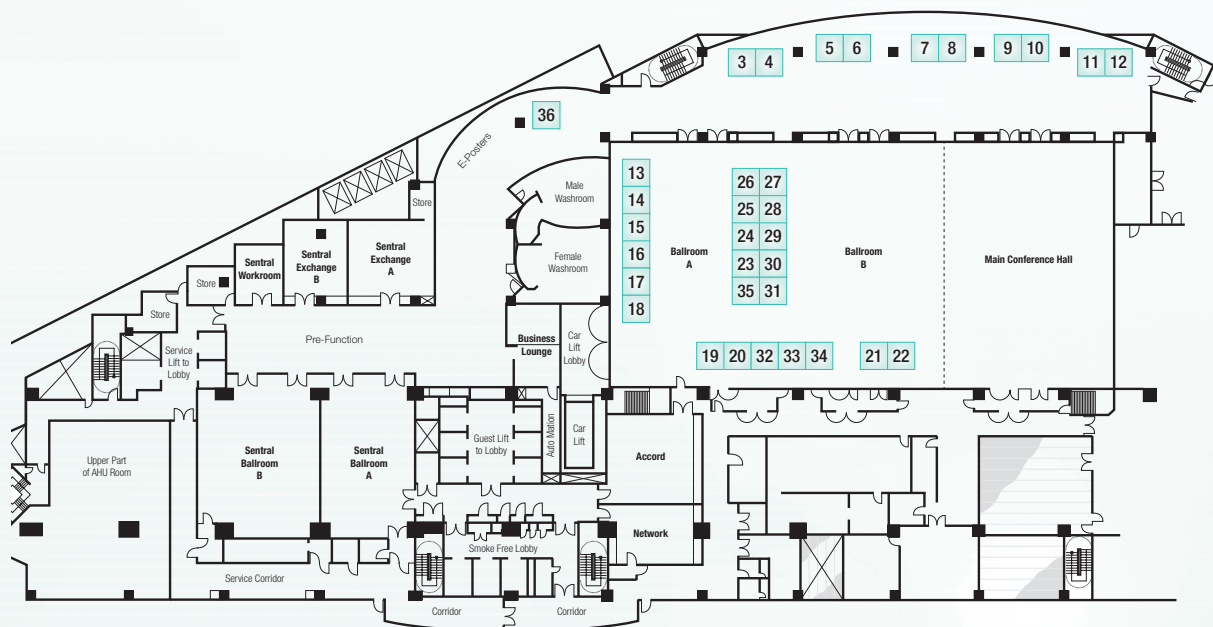
